

# HIGH CARD FLUSH

**High Card Flush** is a suits-based game and you are only looking for a Flush! No understanding of Poker or Poker strategy is needed. It's simple to learn, fun to play, and includes multiple opportunities to win.

#### How to Play

Players begin by placing the Ante wager and any optional side bets. Next, the players and the dealer each receive seven cards.

Players with two, three or four cards in their Flush may raise 1x their Ante.

Players with five cards in their Flush may raise 2x their Ante.

Players with six or seven cards in their Flush may raise 3x their Ante.

#### How to Win

Dealer qualifies with a three-card flush, 9 high.

The best Flush hand wins based on the number of cards in the Flush, and any side bets are reconciled.

Ante: Wins even money if your Flush beats the dealer, or when the dealer does not qualify.

**Raise**: Wins even money if your Flush beats the dealer, or "push" when the dealer does not qualify.

## **Optional Side Bets**

**Flush:** Wins odds with a 4-card Flush or better in the player's hand.

Straight Flush: Wins odds with a 3-card Straight Flush or better in the player's hand.

(Flush and Straight Flush wagers are independent of the outcome of the Ante and Raise.)





## Flush

Number of Flush Cards	Odds
7	300 to 1
6	100 to 1
5	10 to 1
4	1 to 1

Wins odds based on the number of cards containing a Flush.

# Straight Flush

Number of Straight Flush Cards	Odds
7	8000 to 1
6	1000 to 1
5	100 to 1
4	60 to 1
3	7 to 1

Wins odds based on the number of cards containing a Straight Flush.

 An Ace may be used as either the lowest or highest rank in a Straight Flush; otherwise, an Ace is the highest valued card.

 Only the highest qualifying hand is paid. Should a player's seven-card hand consist of more than one Straight Flush, only the highest Straight Flush will be paid (number of cards in the Straight Flush).
